There are few sights in Paris that have changed as little over the past 350 years as the Tuileries, the grandfather of French gardens. Long before it was a public thoroughfare, the Tuileries was the place to see and be seen, to seduce and to be seduced, to practice one's vices, and display one's virtues. Stroll through the Tuileries and Carrousel Gardens on a walking tour, starting outside the Louvre or Orsay Museums. Leaving Paris' busy streets behind. Our presenter will transport you back to the era of the garden's creation when it was the stomping ground of kings and queens.

Gary Kraut is a native West Trentonian who has been living in Paris for 30 years while returning frequently to New Jersey. He works as a travel writer and lecturer specialized in France. In 2009 he had the honor of receiving from the GCNJ a "New Jersey Native Garden Award" for an article that he wrote about celebrating Arbor Day in New Jersey. In the years since, he has written and published numerous travel articles about gardens in France.
