MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

The West Trenton Garden Club Meeting was held via the internet as a ZOOM meeting on February 1, 2021. Twenty-eight members participated. President Barbara Bernhard called the meeting to order at 7:06. She welcomed all members back for the start of a new year-2021, as well as our guest speaker Hubert Ling. She announced that Jeannie Geremia, the President of the Garden Club of New Jersey is ill and if anyone wants to send her a get well card her address is in our yearbook. Barbara thanked Camille Rainiero and her committee for a wonderful ZOOM Holiday Party. She also thanked Terry Palise and Janis Stia for their good work with the Poinsettia Sale. Barbara also gave birthday wishes to January and February birthday members.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Secretary Linda Gerasimowicz reported there were no meetings since November and the November meeting minutes were in the Newsletter. Hearing no additions or corrections, the minutes will be filed as reported.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer, Susan Fair reported a total of \$7,698.60 in the Club's account. Hearing no concerns, the amount will be filed as reported.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT

Corresponding Secretary, Iliana Okum reported sending a get well card to Jeannie Geremia.

AGENDA ITEMS

Morven- Barbara Bernhard congratulated chair Heidi Furman and her committee for placing 1st in the Morven Holiday Tree Decorating. The Club's tree received 260 votes which was more than the 2nd and 3rd place trees combined. Heidi stated the Club has already received an invitation to participate this coming year.

Birmingham Park-Rick Lazarick informed the members of a project to identify and label the plants and shrubs at the Park. He states it will be a 3 step process. First, identify the plants and shrubshe will need help from the members to do this. Second, put these on a plot plan with labels so the public can identify them. Third, put something on our website and eventually a QR code to click on with your phone which would connect to our website. This will be an ongoing project and will need volunteers.

Chair, Heidi Furman states she will need volunteers to help with clean up at the Park, probably in March.

Committees-Pat Bowker will be moving out of the area and several committees chaired by her will need to be filled. Linda Gerasimowicz has volunteered to chair Hospitality, Iliana Okum has volunteered to co-chair Programs. Barbara stated a chair and possibly co-chair are needed for the Flower Show. Pat has volunteered to compile a

detailed list of what this entails and will meet with whoever volunteers to take on this position. She has several storage bins with flower show supplies as well as Hospitality items.

Grant for Nursery Signage-Helga Fontus stated she applied for a grant to help educate the public about plants that attract pollinators by putting signage at area Nurseries. The Club did not receive the Grant money because the State said the Club did not dedicate enough of it's own money to the project.

Spring Flower Sale-Chair, Sue Fair states she finally was able to speak with someone at Davino and hopes to get a price list soon. She states there will be the option to donate flowers to Birmingham Park again.

Scholarship-Chair, Camille Rainiero states she sent applications to Ewing High, Villa Victoria, Steinert and the Sypek Center. A discussion ensued as to why it was opened up to schools other than Ewing High. The reason for offering the scholarships is to promote study of sciences involving horticulture, landscape design, etc. The amount of the scholarships will depend on available funds. The Board approved \$1,000. There is a \$2,000 amount in the yearly budget. Applicants have to submit a transcript, essay, letters of recommendation and proof of college they are attending. Camille states she does have a committee to help with the selection process.

Flowers for the Library-Chair Alicia Magee states we are still placing pictures in Marazzos in Ewing.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Barbara Bernhard announced the next Board Meeting is February 22nd and the next General Meeting is March 1st. Newsletter items need to be sent to Jeff Tryon by February 15th.

Iliana Okum stated the Rose Society is selling roses again and she is sending the form for Jeff to try to attach it to the Newsletter.

Fredricka Billups motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:41. It was seconded by Iliana Okum.

Program-Co-chair Anne Chmielewski then introduced Hubert Ling who was presenting a program on Native Wildflowers for the Home Garden.

FLOWERS FOR THE EWING LIBRARY



GCNJ ENVIRONMENTAL ALERT

NATIONAL INVASIVE PLANTS AWARENESS WEEK

FEBRUARY 22-26, 2021

February 22-26, 2021 is National Invasive Species Awareness Week. Calls-to-action nationwide recognize the threat of invasive species to plants, birds, wildlife, and habitats.

Invasive flora and fauna negatively impact the balance of our ecosystems. Invasive plants include both native and non-native species. Invasives spread easily and grow densely by out-competing desirable vegetation for light and nutrients. Invasive varieties dominate an area by overrunning beneficial plants and preventing healthy regeneration.

Listed below are five common invasive plant species in New Jersey that should be removed and controlled. Unfortunately, some are standard nursery stock.

- 1. **Honeysuckle** A non-native vine which includes multiple species, but mostly the tatarian variety should be removed.
- Buckthorn A non-native plant which includes the Common and Glossy varieties.
- 3. **Japanese Barberry** A non-native shrub found spreading easily in forests, meadows, and wetlands.
- 4. **Hay-Scented Fer**n A native fern that grows in dense mats outcompeting any desirable vegetation on the forest floor.
- 5. American Beech A native tree that proliferates in both shade and sun out-competing surrounding forest. If kept in check, American Beech is an important habitat for birds and other wildlife.
