January is the time to evaluate plants and to begin shaping and thinning of small trees and shrubs. Consider taking a pruning class at Rutgers Gardens!

Looking forward to the months ahead and to seeing everyone on February 6. Our program speakers David and Linda Byers will talk about **Rebuilding Neighborhoods through Horticulture**.

Carolyn Kane moved to adjourn the meeting and Terry Palise seconded the motion.



The West Trenton Garden Club was awarded **second place** of the Peoples' Choice at the Festival of Trees at the Morven Museum. First place was awarded to McCarter Theater. Third Place was awarded to the Princeton Library.
