Did you know?

1. You should harvest herbs on a dry morning, after dew has dried. The exception is mint, which you want to pick at midday, when essential oil concentrations in leaves are greatest. Avoid harvesting herbs following a rain, when foliage is wet. Pick fresh herbs for use and drying
2. Even though tomatoes continue to ripen after picking, fruits develop greatest flavor when allowed to ripen on plants. The exception is cherry tomatoes, which are prone to splitting. Pick these tasty morsels as soon as fruits start showing color.

I look forward to seeing all of you at the August 7 meeting. And I am extending an invitation to all members to get involved with the many projects that are in the works for the coming year.

Hope to see most of you at our August meeting.

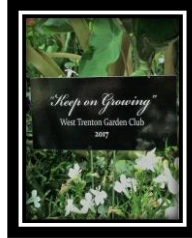

**Horticulture Final Report
June 2017
1867 Sanctuary at Ewing**



The 1867 Sanctuary at Ewing is a regional historic landmark that will be 150 years old in November 2017. Located at 101 Scotch Road, Preservation New Jersey became a recipient of an operating grant from the New Jersey Historical Commission and created a Community Arts & Cultural Center from this historical church.

Communicating with the Operational Managers Bob and Helen Kull last year, we worked out a collaborative relationship linking the West Trenton Garden Club with the Sanctuary to support each other by beautifying the front of the church building with 2 bold, beautiful planters to be placed to either side of their new planned outdoor benches.

This spring we met and firmed up the plan to beautify the front of the church for its 150th celebration. After agreeing on the specific planters and colors of the flowers to be placed in them, the Sanctuary contributed the pots and plants from their funds and we supplied the soil, signage and manpower to complete the plantings.

On Wednesday, June 21, 2017, four of our committee members set the planters and flowers in place to be displayed for the rest of the year. Now, we will wait for them to grow and fill out to show their fullest beauty for this elegant setting. We will check back once or twice to be sure the plantings are growing as expected and help with any questions or problems in the process of taking over maintenance.

Needless to say, we were thanked repeatedly for our interest and contributing our time to create a special setting for their 150th Celebration in our common community setting in Ewing township.

Our committee felt gratified to help through the West Trenton Garden Club horticulture commitments and resources to establish a firm relationship with another community enrichment program for the residents of Ewing Township and the greater Trenton area.
